I was in Beardstown in 1991 for the first time to visit a few relatives and see all the sites. I happen to be a genealogist by hobby since 1990 with over 2000 in the tree - so cousin? Why did you put conrad on the WEB?

Have to go to work now - bye!

1/11/97 Roger Marty:

Not familiar with the Mayreis name right off the top of my head. Send the url of where you found this. I just searched my genealogy database and find no Mayreis. Thanks for the email.

1/12/97 Roger Marty:

I finally made a connection with Conrad Mayreis. My Great Great Grandfather, Gottlieb Marty, sold land to Conrad in Beardstown, IL. I can send you copies of the deeds if you would like them. I was perplexed by your email as the Mayreis was familiar to me but I could not find it in my genealogy database. Who would have figured that the descendants of Gottlieb and Conrad would be communicating on the

Internet some 140 years after they did business together. I am certain they would be very surprised.

Glad you found it - I would be very interested/happy to see a copy of the deed. So who is the genealogist in the family? Have you ever been to Beardstown, Illinois? I have a copy of a beardstown newspaper photo of Main street from about 1850 - dirt road, wooden boardwalk in front of the stores, etc.... Have you seen this?

1/14/97 Roger Marty:

I am the crazy one here. Got the bug when I was about 40. Wish I had started years earlier as many who would have remembered where gone by then. I have reproduced the Deed's in MS Word and can send you those attached to an email or I will send copies of the old documents. If you send me a mailing address. I would love a copy of the old newspaper as my ancestors were living there in that time frame. I have never been to Beardstown but I am working on plans for a trip to Illinois in April of this year. Hope to be able to take some time and go there. I have the lot descriptions of the land sold to Conrad and would love to go see the property. Also would like to visit the Lutheran Church, County Courthouse and cemetery. Let me know how you wish me to send the deeds.

1/18/97 Dean Mayreis:

YES - I suppose that all who have been hooked on genealogy wish they had started collecting/researching at birth! Please send the MS word copy on down. If you can accept scanned images by EMAIL, I will send copies of Beardstown photos. Let me know.

Haven't forgotten about you/photos - had to attend a funeral in Florida last week - came back sick.

2/23/97 Dean Mayreis:

I just remembered that I have a book indexed by last name that is inscriptions copied from all the headstones in Cass county. If you would like me to look up a particular name - I would be happy to. Marty is not in there.

2/23/97 Dean Mayreis:

I'm not sure if this went through the first time - so here it is again I found some time to scan the image - the original photo clipping I have was very dark as the paper has faded over the years, so I used the one in the published version form the Beardstown chamber of commerce. You can obtain this 150 year anniversary edition for about \$6-10 by writing to them. It's 128 pages (many photos) with history starting from the Indian occupation, founding by Thomas Beard, up to 1979. Some where I also have the original full newspaper with the photo and attached text - we'll be moving soon and should turn up then - will let you know. In the lower left corner of the photo is a boot, shoe & leather shop. Initially I thought that was my great grand fathers store, but in further research found it was the smaller shop in the middle/right side with the peaked roof. When you get a chance, send down the MS WORD file of the DEED. ENJOY

DEED OF TRUST

Gottlieb Marty
To
Conrad Mayreis

A.D. Filed for Record Feb. 21st 1881
at 1 O'clock P.M.
J.E. Downing Recorder

The Grantor Gottlieb Marty and Elizabeth Marty his wife of the County of Cass and State of Illinois for and in consideration of four thousand dollars, in hand paid, convey and warrant to Conrad Mayreis of the city of Beardstown, County of Cass and State of Illinois the following described real estate.

The east half of the north east quarter of Section thirty four (34) and the west half of the north west quarter of Section thirty five (35) all in township eighteen (18) north range twelve (12) west of the third principal meridian, situated in the County of Cass in the State of Illinois hereby releasing and waiving all rights under and by virtue of the Homestead Exemption Laws of this State.

Dated this third day of August A.D. 1880.
